



Commissioned Artwork

Thank you for your interest in commissioning a painting by the artist Susan Heidi.

Susan looks forward to working with you to create a piece of artwork that you will enjoy for years to come.

Thanks for the inquiry! I am happy that you enjoy my artwork :)

I am definitely available to do a commissioned painting from photographs – this is usually how I work since my larger paintings can take from 40-80 hours to complete.

I'd like to know a bit more about what you are looking for in terms of size and subject matter (keep in mind that I don't paint nudes at this time – scantily clad is ok). My artwork ranges from 11" x 14" black & white sketches to 30" x 40" full figure acrylic paintings. My paintings can be done in watercolor or acrylics.

Do you have a budget in mind? This might be a good starting place for me to recommend what type and size of painting would fit within your budget (I will supply examples). Also, some pictures that you are thinking of working from would be helpful. High resolution pictures are needed to get the best likeness, but aren't necessary for the preliminary stages.

Some things to keep in mind for any commissioned work:

30% deposit, approval of preliminary sketch, and signed contract due with initial order (payable through paypal, credit card, check, or money order) – work will not begin until payment has cleared.

Additional 20% due after working drawing is complete

Final payment due upon completion of painting (prior to shipment).

Copyrights and rights to reproduction will remain with the artist unless otherwise agreed upon.

Throughout the process I will keep you updated via e-mail on the progress of the painting (including pictures of the work in progress). I would also make every effort to work within an acceptable time-frame for completion of the painting, keeping in mind that my large full-figure paintings take between 4 – 6 weeks to complete from idea to finished work.

I hope to hear more from you about this project and look forward to meeting your artwork needs.
